#### Acceptable electronics

- Televisions
- Computers and all computer components such as monitors, laptops, central processing units (CPUs), circuit boards, disc drives, integrated circuits (ICs), mainframes, keyboards, mice, modems, and wires and cables
- Consumer electronics such as cell phones and all telephone equipment; printers and copiers; VCR/CD/DVD players, audio processors, tape drives, radios, stereos, camcorders, electronic games, and old CDs/DVDs

#### Not accepted electronics

- Audio and video cassettes
- Household appliances

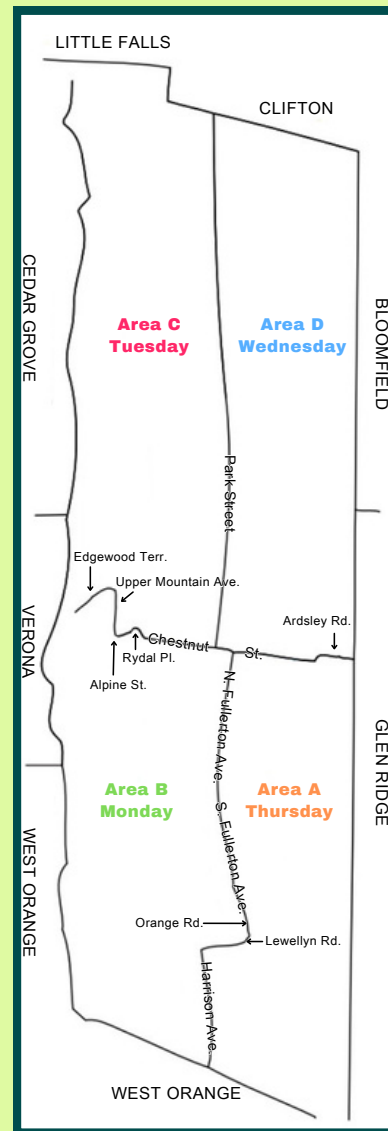
### HOME COMPOSTING PROGRAM

## CURBSIDE RECYCLING

### Mixed paper products

- Newspaper and magazines
- Cardboard (Must be dry, no wax coating)
- All office paper and envelopes
- Paper bags
- Junk mail, sweepstakes mailings, and coupons
- Postcards and greeting cards
- Math and composition paper
- Paperback books and hardcover books (hard covers removed)
- Phone books and real estate books
- Non-metallic wrapping paper

### Commingled materials

- All plastic narrow neck containers one gallon or smaller, marked as 1, 2, and 5 type plastics
- Aluminum and tin cans
- Clear, brown, and green glass bottles and jars (unbroken)
- Poly-laminated paper containers (i.e. milk and juice cartons)
- Aseptic packaging containers (small lined juice containers)

### NOT ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING

- No plastic bags
- No food containers or wrappers
- No metal or glass other than food containers
- No paper cups, paper towels, or plates
- No packing materials
- No Styrofoam
- No shredded paper
- No wax paper/liners

**All plastic bottle caps, lids, and straws go in the garbage**
